Also, we had some amazing news this week. After a long tough battle with the DfE, we have had confirmation that we have secured a bid for 2.1 million pounds worth of work to be completed on our building!!!!! This is an amazing achievement, backed all the way by the Diocese. We are absolutely delighted that many issues can now be addressed and are looking forward to the installation of new boilers and new roofs throughout the building. St Gabriel has certainly been looking after us this half term. It is very unusual for Schools to receive bids as large as this, which reflects the DfEs confidence in us as a community.

In the next 2 months we will convert to the St Theresa of Calcutta Academy Trust. We have been working closely with them already and our new Chapel is named the St Theresa of Calcutta Chapel in honour of St Theresa.

Attendance of students through the half term has remained high. Thank you for battling on also to ensure your child attends. Overall their behaviour has been brilliant, despite having to adapt to split bubbles and remaining mostly in one room. We do acknowledge that this is a challenge for many children.

Free School Meals

Throughout the pandemic we have been paying for free school meals for all the students who are entitled, including the holidays. This will continue to be the case this half term, as we feel it very important that families who are struggling receive our support. As times get tougher, please do not hesitate to contact us if your family begins to struggle financially. We will offer help in whatever way we possibly can, including help with outgrown uniforms wherever our budget will allow. Our prayers are with all families worried about their financial futures and we want you to know that we are behind you at this time.

Coming after half term....

Our British sign language class are preparing to take their first optional exam – go St Gabs BSL group!!!

All students will receive **defibrillator training** as part of our school pledge and a second defibrillator will be in place at school.

City of Trees project will be visiting School to meet our **Eco group**. We aim to support Greater Manchester by planting trees on our school site, whilst our bee garden is growing underground ready for spring.

Comino project commences – we have engaged with a national programme of links between schools and industry, which will see our students working on projects ranging from poets in residence to develop national adverts, media gurus in industry, Canon (cameras) regarding photography skills and many other potential

Again – very much out of our hands due to Covid restrictions and all staff teaching after school on Y11 catch up every day. However, we usually do offer a huge range of clubs and many of these will be resumed after half term within bubbles, including our new ukulele club!!

The school supports my child's wider personal development.

We have lots of personal development opportunities, some of which are mentioned in this letter, plus we
will be going back to our usual trips abroad once the DfE allow this. The Duke of Edinburgh Award
