Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well. As we continue our journey through this academic year, I wanted to share with you a message of hope and encouragement from the Gospels.

In John's Gospel, Chapters 14–17 present us with what is referred to as Jesus' "Last Supper Discourses," or His "Final Discourses." These are a series of sermons given by our Lord to the disciples the night He was arrested. In these discourses, Jesus addresses the coming fear and troubled hearts that He knows His disciples will experience.

Jesus' words to them, and to us, are clear: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." This is a gentle command, yet a command nonetheless. Our Lord knew that His disciples would soon witness His arrest, false accusation, mocking, beating, and death. He wanted to prepare them, to reassure them, and to remind them to keep their faith.

Similarly, our Year 11 Students have settled into their public examinations with energy and vigour. I know this can feel relentless and overwhelming, but we must hold fast to Jesus' words: "Do not let your hearts be troubled." It is natural to dwell on individual questions from the papers that have been sat, but it is important that we focus on the next challenge ahead.

Attendance:

Attendance remains at 92.1%, and consistent attendance is a key driver in student wellbeing and academic success. It will be a key measure for inclusion in the end-of-term trip to Blackpool. Over the next five weeks, we expect 95% attendance from students to ensure entry to the trip. While individual cases will be reviewed by the respective Head of Year based on individual circumstances, we have set the bar high, as it is essential that we reward good attendance.

Work Experience:

We wish our Year 10 students on work experience the very best in their work placements next week. We have managed to place a record number of our students in out of school work places. Those students who have been unable to find placements are working within departments to experience a week in an educational workplace or will be completing work-based activities such as an enterprise day, a town hall visit or virtual work experience. We hope they all enjoy this enriching experience and find new drive and energy to carry them through the next 12 months. Work experience is a valuable opportunity that can clarify future plans and give purpose to their studies, setting clear goals for the next steps.
