An American journalist, after watching Mother Teresa caring for a man with gangrene, remarked to her. 'I wouldn't do that for a million dollars.' Mother Teresa replied: 'Neither would I... But I do it for the love of God.' Selfishness keeps us shut in, builds barriers, even walls, between us and others. What frees us is caring, caring for others, being friends, being sisters and brothers to them, being good neighbours. A doctor, who shared some of the deepest moments in the lives of many patients, says that people facing death don't think about the degrees they've earned, the position they've held, or how much wealth they've amassed. Practicing love has power to heal ourselves and others. To love is to heal, both those who receive and those who give it. To decide to love is to be fully open to life. It is choice and not just feeling. When we choose to be loving, caring healing, helping, and forgiving persons, we grow towards what out life is meant to be. There's really no other way. So Jesus insists, very strongly: 'Love one another, as I have loved you.'
